Get to Know Your Board



SLCT's Board is made up of 10 individuals, five from Sterling and five from Lancaster. The Board governs the direction of the company via strategic planning, goals, objectives, and budgeting.

Our featured Board member for November is Joe Gunther. Joe has resided in Sterling since 1979 and is an original member of Sterling Cable TV Committee. He has degrees in Television/Radio and Rhetoric. Joe is a retired employee of Edward Jones Investments, and is a Boy Scouts of America Eagle Scout. Other volunteer history includes Leominster Hospital (Chair), North Central MA Red Cross, BSA Nashua Valley Council, and Seven Hills Foundation.



When first invented in 1996, DVD was an initialism for the unofficial term "digital videodisk". Within the next few years, certain members of the DVD forum proposed "digital versatile disc" to express that DVDs can store other data formats. However, the forum never universally accepted this name and a 1999 report decreed that DVD was "simply three letters" and stood for "nothing". Since then, usage has varied and there is no universal agreement. "Digital versatile disc" has gained wide acceptance and is used by the official DVD charter, while others such as Toshiba (who maintain the DVD Forum website) use "digital video disc".
