### Get to Know Your Board




SLCT's Board is made up of 10 individuals, five from Sterling and five from Lancaster. The Board governs the direction of the company via strategic planning, goals, objectives, and budgeting.

Our featured Board member for February is Greg Billings. Greg is a retired educator who has worked in several capacitites and grade levels from Kindergarten through college. He has held positions at local schools including Leominster, Ayer, Bolton, and Stow. He has also been a member of the cable TV advisory committees in these towns.

A **teleprompter**, or autocue, is a display device that prompts the person speaking with an electronic visual text of a script. Using a teleprompter is similar to using cue cards. The screen is in front of, and usually below, the lens of a professional video camera, and the words on the screen are reflected to the eyes of the presenter using a sheet of clear glass or a specially prepared beam splitter. Light from the performer passes through the front side of the glass into the lens, while a shroud surrounding the lens and the back side of the glass prevents unwanted light from entering the lens.

Because the speaker does not need to look down to consult written notes, he appears to have memorized the speech or to be speaking spontaneously, looking directly into the camera lens. Cue cards, on the other hand, are always placed away from the lens axis, making the speaker look at a point beside the camera, which leaves an impression of distraction.

**Video Resume Service to be provided...** SLCT will be offering unemployed residents the opportunity to upgrade their job-seeking skills by providing a video resume service.
